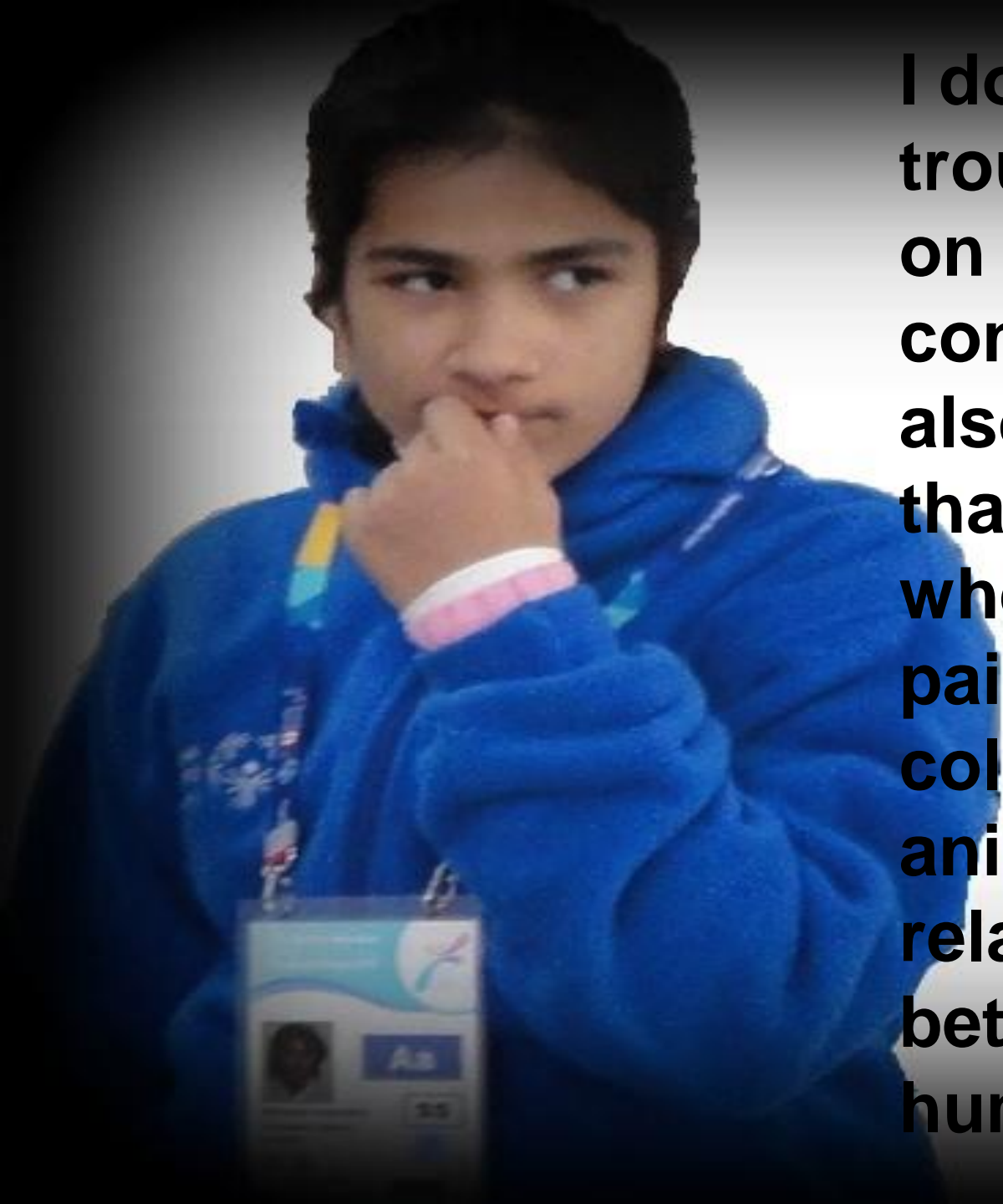


**Hello I am Bipasha,
