Event Overview:

The National Championship Football 2024, themed "Meet the World with SKF," held at the 'Atal Bihari Vajpayee Training Centre for Disability Sports' in Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, served as a significant preparatory platform for the upcoming Gothia Special Olympics Trophy scheduled to be hosted in Sweden in July 2024. From the 25th to the 29th of April 2024, this tournament brought together athletes from across India, showcasing their skills, passion, and sportsmanship.



Participation:

Accompanied by a dedicated support system, including 13 coaches, 04 escorts, 12 referees, 12 officials, 1 medical person and 18 resource persons more than 100 local school students, the event was meticulously organized to ensure a seamless experience for all participants. The diverse representation added a rich tapestry of talent to the competition, fostering a spirit of unity and inclusivity.
