





# Special Olympics Bharat winners of Gothia Cup Football Championship at Sweden.

The SO Bharat Champions scripted history at Gothenburg this year as they aced the tournament, lifting the Gothia Cup, unbeaten in all the matches leading to victory. Supported by SKF India, the Indian team, comprising of ten athletes with Intellectual and developmental delays from six states of India, namely, Delhi, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Puducherry, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal, stamped its maiden entry with an extraordinary performance at the tournament. The send-off ceremony was graced by **Mr. Jan Thesleff, Sweden Ambassador to India.** 



SO Bharat won their opening group game against SO Finland 3-0, and then followed it up with a big win of 6-0 against SO Germany. The Indian contingent won over Hong Kong by 6-0 in Match 3 and then followed it up with another big win by 3-1 against SO Denmark to make it into the final. SO Bharat lifted the trophy after a nail-biting 4-3 win in the final clash with SO Denmark. Our athletes received a grand welcome and the event was graced by Shri Raksha Khadse Ji, MOS Youth Affairs & Sports.

## **Special Olympics Asia Pacific Bocce & Bowling Competition, New Delhi 2024**

The Special Olympics Asia Pacific Bocce & Bowling Competition 2024, organized by Special Olympics Bharat, was held from November 18th to 22nd, 2024, in New Delhi. The historic event marked a significant milestone in the global Special Olympics movement, being the first competition dedicated to older athletes with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD) aged 22 and above.

The competition featured participants from over ten countries spanning three regions—Asia Pacific, East Asia and Europe Eurasia—and embodied the core principles of inclusion, resilience and empowerment.

The event was formally inaugurated by the Hon'ble Vice President of India, Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar, with the opening ceremony presided over by Dr. Mallika Nadda, President of Special Olympics Bharat and Chairperson of the Special Olympics Asia Pacific Advisory Council.





The event marked a groundbreaking step in the evolution of the Special Olympics in introducing bowling competitive sport. This new addition was made possible through a partnership between Special Olympics Bharat and the Tenpin Federation of India. provide older collaboration aimed to with athletes tailored development programs, ensuring they were empowered through the sport of bowling alongside bocce, which has long been part of the Special Olympics repertoire.

In the bocce competition, 44 athletes (22 male and 22 female) from 11 countries within the Asia Pacific region—SO Australia, SO Bangladesh, SO Bharat, SO Hong Kong, SO Indonesia, SO Macau, SO Malaysia, SO Myanmar, SO Philippines, SO Singapore and SO Thailand- competed in a series of events that highlighted the spirit of camaraderie and healthy competition.

The bowling competition saw participation from nine countries with 35 athletes and 17 coaches. The tournament, supported by 37 technical officials, 25 volunteers and 10 venue staff, consisted of three categories: mixed-team, doubles and singles. A total of 91 matches were played across nine divisions, with Indian athletes delivering exceptional performances. India's athletes secured 14 medals in bowling- four gold, six silver and four bronze.

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
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### **World Winter Games Turin 2025**

This training camp has equipped our coaches with crucial techniques and strategies, ensuring they are ready to lead, inspire and positively influence our special athletes.

#### **Bowling & Bocce State Championship 2024**

The Special Olympics Bharat (SO Bharat) State Championships have been a tremendous success across India, showcasing the dedication and enthusiasm of athletes and volunteers. SOB Karnataka hosted a vibrant event with participation from 22 schools, 44 coaches, and 150 volunteers. In Kerala, the championship held on July 26th saw the spirited participation of 20 athletes. SOB Bihar witnessed an impressive turnout with 200 athletes with intellectual disabilities competing in the championships. SOB Assam organized its Bowling State Selection on August 8th, and prior to that, on July 5th, held a Bocce event in Guwahati. SOB Rajasthan conducted the state championship on 28th July, in association with Rudraksh educational society. These events highlight the growing reach and impact of Special Olympics across the country, celebrating inclusivity and athleticism.

The states completed their State Championship / State trials by the month of August to get their state teams ready for the National Championship to be held in month of September from 1st to 5th at Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee Centre of Disability Sports.







#### **Tripura: Promoting Inclusion Amidst Challenges**

In August 2024, Special Olympics Bharat Tripura demonstrated remarkable resilience and progress in advancing inclusion and unity through sports. Despite significant challenges, including the ongoing Panchayat elections and severe floods that led to school closures, the team remained unwavering in their mission. From July 13th to 15th, Tripura celebrated Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav at the NHPC-powered Sports Centre, where Special Athletes delivered outstanding performances across various events, showcasing the spirit of independence, determination and sportsmanship.

Furthering their commitment to athlete well-being, the Healthy Athletes Programme (Special Smiles) was successfully organized on July 30th and August 30th, with the support of the Government Medical Officer, ensuring athletes received vital dental care and support. In addition, key meetings with officials such as the District Education Officer and the State Project Director were held to discuss the implementation of Unified Sports in schools across Tripura. These discussions reflected a strong commitment to expanding inclusive sports programs and creating new opportunities for Special Athletes.

#### **Athlete Leadership Training**






### NATIONAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP CONCLAVE

The event underscored the collective responsibility to create equitable opportunities for all students, including those with intellectual disabilities.

















#### **NATIONAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP SUMMIT 2024**



The National Youth Leadership Summit 2024, organized by Special Olympics Bharat, was a dynamic gathering of youth leaders, athletes, and officials from across 22 states and union territories of India. 



In 2021, at the age of 20, she joined Special Olympics Bharat, a pivotal step that would redefine her path and help her realize her true potential.

Shivani's initial years were marked by struggles in social interaction and personal development, but her time with Special Olympics Bharat catalyzed her transformation. Through specialized training in functional academics and skill-building domains such as prevocational skills, art & craft, home science and sports at NIEPID MSEC, she evolved not just as an athlete but as a confident individual ready to contribute to society. Special Olympics Bharat gave her a platform where she could channel her energy and overcome her earlier limitations.

At the age of 21, Shivani took a bold step into mainstream employment with the DS Group (Catch Masala Company) in Noida. The opportunity allowed her to collaborate with others, contribute meaningfully to her team and prove her capability in a professional environment.

This is the first time that Special Olympics Bharat along with the support of the teams from Kashmir and Leh conducted such a massive Health screening in the areas of Kargil, Baramulla and Kupwara.















## Healthy Athletes Program "MedFest" Hosted by Jharkhand

The "MedFest" event organised by Special Olympics Bharat Jharkhand in collaboration with Asha Lata Viklang Vikas Kendra on 20th September 2024 was a significant milestone for athletes with ID in the region. The health screenings conducted during the event were pivotal not only in identifying and addressing immediate health concerns, but also in ensuring that the athletes were fit and prepared for their upcoming participation in Special Olympics sports. By providing athletes with essential medical evaluations in areas such as Special Smiles (oral health), Healthy Hearing, Fit Feet (foot and lower limb health) and overall health promotion, the event made sure they received the care they need to perform to the best of their abilities.





For many of the athletes, this program marked their first ever exposure to professional healthcare. This can be life-changing, as it enabled the identification of potentially life-threatening conditions such as undiagnosed hearing impairments, dental issues or musculoskeletal problems. Timely interventions through referrals for further treatment were not just a benefit for the athletes' athletic journeys, but also for their overall well-being.

The involvement of dignitaries like Shri Hari Mohan Jha, Chief General Manager of Bokaro Steel Plant, Mr. B S Jaiswal, Director of Asha Lata and Principal Mr. P K Deby in the event's inauguration emphasises the importance of community support and the recognition of the challenges faced by athletes with ID.

During the inauguration, the Hon'ble Minister engaged in discussions with officials from Special Olympics International and Special Olympics Asia Pacific to explore synergies between the health initiatives of Special Olympics and existing government healthcare schemes. The program featured seven disciplines of health screenings, each led by distinguished medical experts.

















## Family Registration Support Workshop Empowers Participants from 21 States- Faridabad Haryana


