

Special Olympics Bharat hosted the Special Olympics Asia Pacific Bocce and Bowling Competition from November 18th to 23rd, 2024 in New Delhi, marking a historic moment for the city and the Special Olympics movement. The event was officially inaugurated by the Hon'ble Vice President of India, Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar in the presence of Smt. Sudesh Dhankar, Dr. Mansukh L. Mandaviya, Hon'ble Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports & Minister of Labour and Employment, Government of India, Shri Naveen Jindal, Hon'ble Member of Parliament; and Shri Asim Arun, Hon'ble Minister of State I/C for Social Welfare and SC/ST Welfare, Government of Uttar Pradesh, welcomed by Dr. Mallika Nadda, President of Special Olympics Bharat and Chairperson of the Special Olympics Asia Pacific Advisory Council and Mr. Dipak Natali, Regional President and Managing Director Special Olympics Asia Pacific.

This competition which focused on older athletes with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD) aged 22 and above, was the first of its kind on a global scale to be held in India. It offered unique opportunities for this oftenunderserved age group, whose participation in sports typically declines as they get older.

The Special Olympics Asia Pacific Bocce & Bowling Competition 2024 celebrated athletes with intellectual disabilities through:

- sporting competitions
- free health screenings
- key health initiatives, including the Inclusive Health Summit which unveiled fresh research (Rosemary Collaboratory).

100 Athletes from

12 Special Olympics Programs participated in the competition.

The countries that participated were Australia, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Hong Kong, Thailand, Macau, Uzbekistan, Singapore and India. They hailed from 3 different regions, namely, East Asia, Europe Eurasia, and Asia Pacific.

Special Olympics Bharat focused on reducing sports and health disparities for people with intellectual disabilities by promoting inclusive sports and inclusive healthcare systems. It also marked a historic first for Special Olympics Bharat (SO Bharat) as it introduced bowling as a competitive sport in partnership with the Tenpin Federation of India. The partnership aims to empower older athletes aged 22 and above through a ground-breaking initiative designed around a dedicated development program.















## **COMPETITION - 19 TO 22 NOV**





#### **OVERVIEW - BOCCE GAME**

A total 44 athletes 22 Male & 22 Female from 12 countries had participated from Asia Pacific region including SO Australia, SO Bangladesh, SO Bharat, SO Hong Kong, SO Indonesia, SO Macau, SO Malaysia, SO Myanmar SO Pilippines, SO Singapore, & SO Thailand.

#### **OVERVIEW - BOWLING GAME**

The bowling events witnessed participation from 9 countries, with 35 athletes and 17 coaches. The events were supported by 37 technical officials, 25 technical volunteers, and 10 venue staff. The competition featured three events: mix-team, doubles, and singles. The mix-team event had three divisions, the doubles event had five divisions, and the singles event had nine divisions. A total of 91 matches were played during the competition.























## **CLOSING CEREMONY - 22ND NOV**













The Competition concluded with a memorable Closing Ceremony at the Thyagaraj Sports Complex, celebrating the spirit of resilience, determination, and friendship among athletes from across Asia Pacific, East Asia, and Europe Eurasia. The event, which ran from November 18 to 22, saw inspiring performances and sportsmanship, bringing together participants, supporters, and families in a powerful display of unity to celebrate achievements and reiterate commitment to promote opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across India.

India finished the competition with an impressive haul of 25 medals in which the bowling contingent contributed 14 medals including four gold, six silver and four bronze medals while the bocce team hauled 11 medals which included one gold, four silver and six bronze medals.

The closing ceremony was graced by Shri. Brajesh Pathak, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh as the Chief Guest and Shri. Pabitra Margherita, Hon'ble Minister of State of External Affairs as the Guest of Honour along with Shri. Gaurav Gautham, Hon'ble Minister of State for Youth Empowerment & Entrepreneurship (IC), Sports (IC), Law & Legislative, Government of Haryana and Dr. Mallika Nadda, President Special Olympics Bharat.
























#### **INCLUSIVE HEALTH SUMMIT - 18 NOV 2024**
























## **CARNIVAL**
