

Air Marshal Denzil Keelor, born on December 7, 1933, in Lucknow, was a highly respected leader and a distinguished officer of the Indian Air Force. His exemplary career as a fighter pilot and leader spanned from 1953 until his retirement as Inspector General in 1991. Over the course of his service, he was awarded the highest honors, including the Param Vishist Seva Medal (PVSM), Kirti Chakra (KC), Ati Vishist Seva Medal (AVSM), Vir Chakra (VrC), and commendations from four consecutive Presidents of India, making him as the most decorated officer in the country. Following his military career, Air Marshal Keelor dedicated his life to serving others, founding Special Olympics Bharat, where his leadership expanded the program from 25,000 to 1.4 million athletes across India. His integrity, character, and unwavering commitment to the cause earned him international recognition, including the Special Spirit of China Award of Excellence in 2007, alongside figures like Nelson Mandela. He was deeply admired for his relentless efforts in advocating for people with intellectual disabilities and his profound impact on the Special Olympics movement worldwide.

Athletes learned about the key components that make an effective leader through an in-depth explanation, followed by an engaging quiz to reinforce these concepts.

To maintain the lively atmosphere, the group played "Simon Says" to avoid any monotony. We then highlighted how leadership skills can be applied to daily life, using practical examples and videos that illustrate how athletes can balance their sports and personal lives.

The session concluded with a homework assignment to help solidify the concepts, followed by a group photo to capture the day's happening and smiling faces of our athletes.




SO Bharat Leadership at Special Olympics Asia Pacific's Strategic Meeting

The two-day Strategic Meeting with Special Olympics Asia Pacific led to productive discussions on the Organizational Structure and Delivery Model for SO Bharat, SO Bangladesh, and SO Indonesia. The session was graced by key leaders, including Dr Mallika Nadda, President of SO Bharat, General Secretary Dr D.G. Chaudhary, Ms Mukta Narain Thind, Director of Organization Development & International Relations, and Ms Richa Chauhan, Manager of International Relations.



A comprehensive review of the existing organizational structure was conducted, highlighting key strengths and areas for improvement. A particular focus was placed on understanding how the national office framework extends to the state and district levels. Dr. Mallika Nadda presented SO Bharat's organizational structure, emphasizing the importance of a well-integrated approach from the grassroots to the national level.







The strategic planning meetings are organized to discuss the impact of Covid -19 on the Special Olympics Programs and its outreach. The region recorded a drop of 85% in athlete engagement. The discussion were held on developing sustainable structures to promote sustained outreach and engagement. All three countries discussed their models; SO Bharat focuses on School based model while developing centres of excellence through SO Bharat Sports Centres.

SO Bharat had reached out to **1.5 Million** athletes till the year 2019. The focus is to generate unique verifiable data through digital registrations on SO Bharat Portal. SO Bharat will focus on reaching out **1,207,601** young athletes and athletes by 2030 by registering new and registering the old athletes into the system




