Coaches Training

Table Tennis Coaches Training Program by Puducherry

Special Olympics Bharat – Puducherry organised a Table Tennis Coaches Training Program on 25th January 2025 at the Satya Skill Training Centre. The program aimed to equip educators and students with the necessary knowledge and skills to promote inclusivity through sports. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from 30 special educators from Satya Special School and 8 Physical Education students from Pondicherry University. The program began with an insightful orientation session led by Mr. Ramji, Program Coordinator, Special Olympics Bharat Puducherry. He provided an overview of Special Olympics Bharat, highlighting its mission and objectives. Mr. Ramji also introduced the concept of Unified Sports, emphasising the importance of fostering inclusion by bringing together athletes with and without intellectual disabilities. Additionally, he explained the Special Olympics division process, which ensures fair competition by grouping athletes based on their ability levels. The core training sessions were conducted by expert Table Tennis coaches Mr Manibharathi and Mr Udaya. These sessions focused on skill assessment, which is understanding the abilities of athletes and tailoring coaching strategies accordingly. The coaches provided hands-on demonstrations and engaged participants in practical activities, ensuring an interactive and enriching learning experience.









SPECIAL OLYMPICS WORLD WINTER GAMES, TURIN, ITALY, 2025

Preparatory Camps for Special Olympics World Winter Games Turin 2025

In the lead-up to the Special Olympics World Winter Games Turin 2025, a series of comprehensive **National Preparatory Coaching Camps** were conducted across three cities in India: **Gurgaon, Chandigarh, and Narkanda**, each carefully chosen to provide optimal training conditions for different winter sports disciplines.

Gurgaon played host to the Speed Skating and Figure Skating coaching camps. Equipped with state-of-the-art facilities and expert coaches, the camps in Gurgaon focused on refining the technical skills, agility and performance consistency of the athletes, ensuring they were competition-ready for the international stage.











Chandigarh served as the training ground for **Floorball**, a fast-paced indoor team sport. The camps here emphasised team coordination, strategy development and physical endurance, vital for success at the global level.

Narkanda, nestled in the snow-clad mountains of Himachal Pradesh, provided the perfect natural environment for **Snow Sports**. Athletes trained in **Alpine Skiing**, **Snowboarding**, **Snowshoeing and Cross-Country Skiing**, taking full advantage of the region's slopes and climate. These high-altitude camps not only improved athletic performance but also built resilience and acclimatisation to winter conditions similar to those in Italy.

Across all disciplines, multiple National Preparatory Coaching Camps were conducted for each sport. These camps were made possible through the support of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports and the Sports Authority of India (SAI), whose efforts played a critical role in providing quality coaching, nutritional support, sports science interventions and infrastructure.



The Global Youth Leadership Summit held from 8 to 10 March 2025 in Turin brought together **75 leaders, including Unified pairs** – composed of a young leader with intellectual disabilities and a young leader without intellectual disabilities – and their respective adult mentors. The leaders, from 25 Special Olympics programs worldwide, demonstrated how young people are rising to the challenge as the next generation of inclusive

Unified pairs Samriddhi and Ashi from Karnataka, along with their mentor Ms. Uttara Chaudhury, proudly represented Special Olympics Bharat at the Global Youth Leadership Summit. Their participation highlighted their dedication to promoting inclusivity and empowering youth leaders in the global arena.

Welcome Ceremony for Athletes

Health & Family

Family Registration Support Workshop Empowers
